

Lanark County's wildflower seed mix includes 24 native pollinator-friendly species

Instructions:

1.Transfer seed mix to a resealable containers

2.To prepare seeding areas, remove weeds, cultivate and pack soil

3.Blooms best in full sun areas in moist-mesic, well drained soils

4.Sow in late fall (best time) or early spring, avoid summer planting or in times of drought
