Native Seed Mix

Lanark County's wildflower seed mix includes 22 native pollinator-friendly species

Instructions:

1. Store seed mix in a resealable container
2. To prepare seeding areas, remove weeds, cultivate and pack soil
3. Blooms best in full sun areas in moist-mesic, well drained soils
4. Sow in late fall (best time) or early spring, avoid summer planting or in times of drought
