Allowance Grants:



PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Lanark County RECEs and ECE assistants are supported by the Lanark Early Learning Child Care Association (LELCCA). This committee is made up of Early Childhood Educators across Lanark County. There are regular length programs (typically 4 semesters – 2 years) and accelerated/fast track programs (less than a year in length). There are also francophone and aboriginal programs available.
