Native Seed Mix

Lanark County's wildflower seed mix includes 24 native pollinator-friendly species

Instructions:

1. Store seed mix in a resealable container.
2. To prepare seeding areas, remove weeds and unwanted vegetation and lightly loosen up the soil.
3. Sow the seeds in late fall after the first frost (best time) or early spring,
4. Use a seed roller or walk over the seeds to ensure good soil to seed contact. Do not bury seeds.
5. Blooms best in full sun areas in moist, well drained soils.
