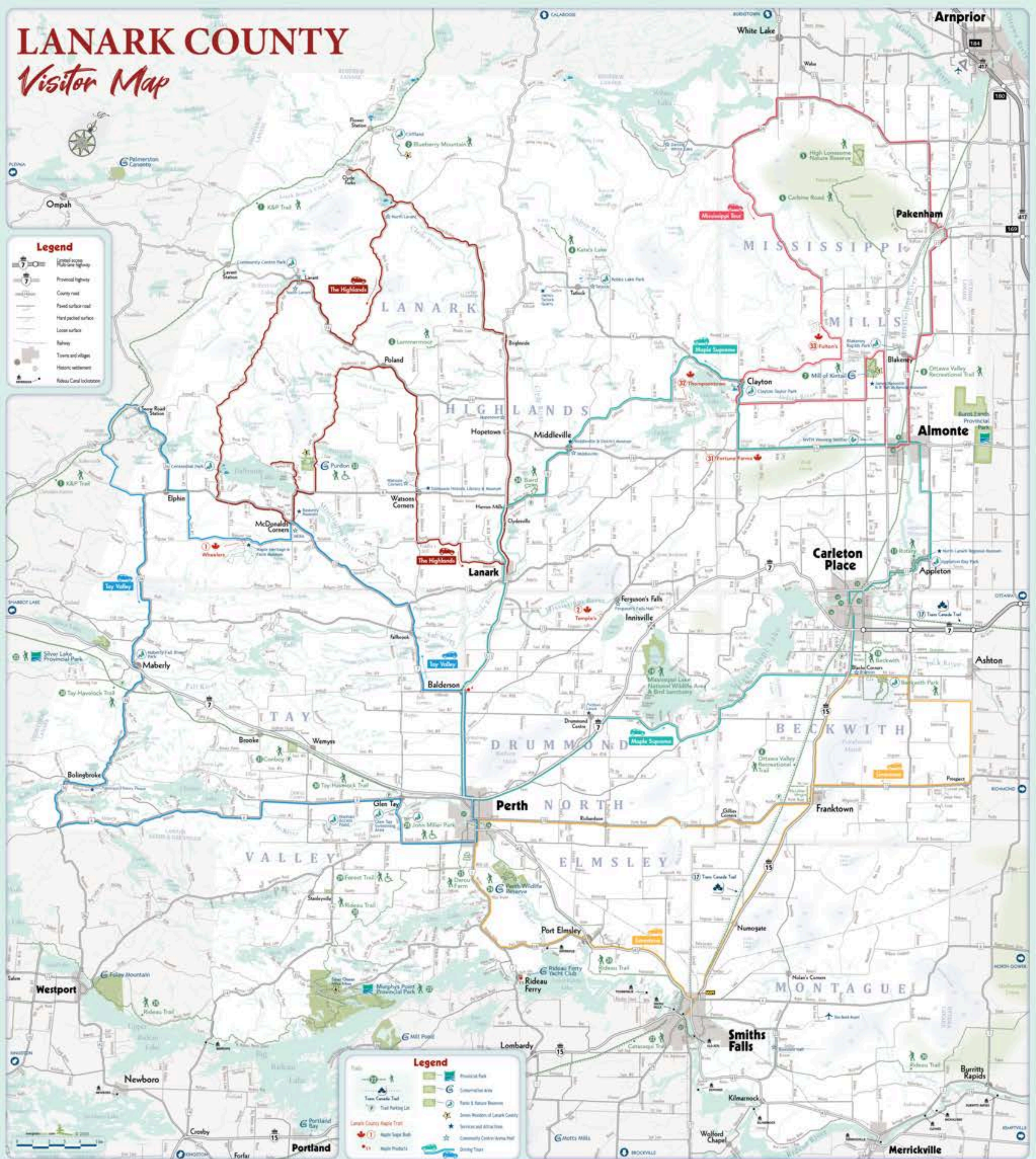

Seven Wonders of Lanark County

- Here are seven wonderful destinations to head for in Lanark County. You can find these along the driving tours, and at many of the parks and trails featured on the map.
- 1. The Mill of Kintail**
The Mill of Kintail showcases the restored studio and home of Robert Tait Mackenzie, sculptor, physician and designer. This 152-acre conservation area is also home to the Dr. James Nasmyth Museum, dedicated to the inventor of basketball, an Almonte local.
 - 2. St. Peter Celestine Church**
St. Peter Celestine Church in Pakenham is one of only three Canadian churches known to retain its particular Classic Italianate interior decoration. Its superb original décor was restored as part of the church's centennial celebrations in 1993.
 - 3. The Five-Span Stone Bridge**
The Five-Span Stone Bridge in Pakenham was built in 1903 by Scottish stone masons and restored in 1984. Its remarkable design is the only one of its kind in North America.
 - 4. Blueberry Mountain**
Blueberry Mountain is the highest point in Lanark County, overlooking a breathtaking view of natural forest and wetlands. This nature preserve, named "d'ELAND," honours the Clifford family, stewards of the land.
 - 5. The Showy Lady's Slipper Orchids**
The Showy Lady's Slipper Orchids at Pardon Conservation Area are the largest colony of these plants found anywhere in Canada - over 16,000. This beautiful colony of orchids blooms each year between mid-June and July.
 - 6. The Silver Queen Mine**
Operating between 1903 and 1920, the Silver Queen Mine was a marvel of its day. Minerals were shipped by barge along the Rideau Canal and by train from Perth. Located within Murphy's Point Provincial Park, the mine is open for scheduled tours in the summer.
 - 7. Beautiful Stewart Park**
Beautiful Stewart Park, a five-acre green space along the Tay River, was donated to the town of Perth in memory of the Honourable John Alexander Stewart, a prominent figure in the town's history.
