Museums

Uncover the secrets of Lanark's diverse and fascinating history at the museums listed below. Check our website for opening hours and entrance fees.

Carleton Place & Beckwith Heritage Museum (open year-round)
267 Edmund Street, Carleton Place
Explore the history of the area through exhibits, walking tours, and events.

Heritage House Museum (open year-round)
11 Old Slys Road, Smiths Falls
Highlights the cultural history of Smiths Falls and displays art from local artists.

James Naismith & R Tait McKenzie Museums (open seasonally)
654 Ramsay Court E, Mississippi Mills
Features collections highlighting the lives of two famous local figures.

Lanark & District Museum (open year-round)
80 George Street, Lanark Village
This museum has an extensive collection of genealogical records, in addition to a collection of artifacts featuring the history of the Lanark Highlands.

Middleville & District Museum (open seasonally)
2130 Concession Road 6D, Lanark
Located in a former schoolhouse, this museum shows the life of a community from early days of settlement through to the Second World War, with local indigenous artifacts, a log cabin, vintage vehicles, and more.

Mississippi Valley Textile Museum (open year-round)
3 Rossmore Street, Almonte
Interactive museum with rotating exhibits on the textile industry in Canada.

North Lanark Regional Museum (open year-round)
647 River Road, Appleton
Discover the stories of Lanark through exhibits and events or explore the genealogical collection.

Perth Museum (open year-round)
11 Gore Street East, Perth
Explore the stone home originally built for local merchant Frederick Matheson.

Railway Museum of Eastern Ontario (open seasonally)
90 William Street West, Smiths Falls
Ride the rails to the past and experience history for yourself. Enjoy handcar rides, have tea in a dining car, or even spend the night in a vintage caboose.

Events & Festivals

No matter the time of year, there is always a part in Lanark County! From delicious food festivals to cultural displays and concerts, you will find something fun to see and do during your visit.

Listed here are some of the biggest events of the year - and visit our website for a full events listing.

Festival of the Maples
A celebration of all things maple syrup in Downtown Perth. Celebrated each year on the last Saturday of April.

Franktown Liliac Festival
Visit Franktown, the Liliac Capital of Ontario, for horse-drawn wagon rides down Liliac Lane, live music, and more. Last Saturday in May.

Almonte Celticfest
Almonte's summer celebration of Celtic music. Join the fiddlers and dance in Gemmill Park. July.

Stewart Park Festival
A free music festival in Perth's gorgeous Stewart Park. Enjoy an incredible lineup of artists, along with children's activities and food vendors. July.

Lanark County Harvest Festival
Join us in Beckwith Park to celebrate the agricultural heritage of Lanark County with a huge farmer's market, cultural demonstrations, wagon rides, and delicious food. 2nd Sunday in September.

Pumpkinfest
Visit Carleton Place in the fall for a family-friendly, gently spooky, fall festival. Walk in the costume parade, ride the trolley, and enjoy a full weekend of fun. October.

Maple Trail

Prepare to be captivated by the beauty of nature and indulge in the flavors of this local delicacy during your journey through Lanark County's farms and sugar bushes.

Sugar Bushes

- Wheeler's Pancake House & Sugar Camp** (1001 Highland Line, McDonald's Centre)
Bring the whole family for a pancake breakfast dabbled with Wheeler's maple syrup and explore the maple museum, trails, farm animals, and more.
- Temple's Sugar Bush** (1700 Ferguson Falls Road, Lanark)
Experience an old-fashioned superbowl breakfast in a rustic timber-frame building, serving Temple's own maple syrup.
- Fortune Farms & Sugar Bush** (2462 Wolf Grove Road, Almonte)
Walk or snowshoe through a 90-generation maple forest and watch syrup being produced on site. Pick up some fresh maple syrup to take home.
- Thompson's Maple Products** (790 Blackrock Lane, Clayton)
See maple syrup produced from tree to table and sample maple syrup (don't forget to take some home!).
- Fulton's Sugar Bush & Maple Shop** (399 Sugar Bush Rd., Pakenham)
Fun for the whole family, Fulton's has plenty of maple inspired activities to keep everyone busy. Browse the vast selection of maple products in their maple shop.



- Rideau Ferry**
 - CC's on the Rideau** (10/10 Rideau Ferry Rd)
Hot cocoa is all the sweeter when made here with local maple syrup.
- Smiths Falls**
 - The Desert Plate Bakery** (5 Main St W)
Maple syrup makes a frequent appearance on the ingredients in their freshly baked goods.

We've listed thirty-three different sugar bushes and maple products for you to try. Look for these red numbers and symbols on the maps.



- Lanark Village**
 - Clyde Hall** (111 Mill St)
Savour a chef-prepared breakfast served with maple bacon and local maple syrup made from saps gathered on the property.
- Balderson**
 - Balderson Cheese Shop** (1410 Hwy 111)
Browse locally sourced maple products here, including Doran Heights' maple candy and maple butter.
- Perth**
 - Perth Brewery** (221 Dundas St)
Bees meet maple. Perth Brewery's maple ale is a popular brew of year long, but especially in spring.
 - Perth Chocolate Works** (17 Wilcox St)
Party and beausiful, leaf-shaped maple chocolates will be the centerpiece of a box of chocolates here.
 - Fiddleheads** (53 Heron St)
Brunch favourites are served each Sunday and complemented by local maple syrup.
 - The Stone Cellar** (71 Grier St)
"Sweet" takes on a whole new meaning with sweet potato fries made with maple syrup.
 - Maximilian's** (99 Gore St W)
A longtime favourite menu item, the maple glazed pork loin blends European-inspired cuisine with Canadian flavour.
 - Top Shelf Distillery** (21 Watson Cres)
The Rumour Maple Moonshine is crafted from corn. Served with Lanark County maple syrup, and pair a must try for craft spirit and maple lovers.

Salt and sweet pair well in HTF's maple bacon donut, and with half the fat of regular donuts you can eat twice as much.

Maple cream liqueur is creamy, delicious and made with local maple syrup.
 - Baker Bob's** (73 Little Bridge St)
Experience maple in a pie at Baker Bob's - their maple mousser and maple pecan pie are maplelicious.
 - Dan's Meat Market** (126 Mill St)
The sweetness of maple complements the spicy flavour of Dan's maple Chipotle sausages.
 - Mill Street Crepe Company** (4 Mill St)
Not just for breakfast, these light and airy crepes are perfect served with local maple syrup.

Baked beans are dished up Lanark County-style here.

Topped with a homemade maple glaze and fresh cooked bacon, the Honey donut is a must try.

Find unique hot sauces crafted with local maple syrup ingredients.

Ask for one of their maple bacon or maple dip donuts for a fun twist on donut flavours.

Pick up some maple breakfast sausages for true Lanark County breakfast fare.

Explore the vast cheese and homemade fudge selection, including maple fudge.

MISSISSIPPI TOUR

Quiet villages, rugged farmland and acres upon acres of sugar bush draw strength from the Mississippi River which has fuelled the growth of this corner of Lanark County for over 200 years. Mills, timber, agriculture and now recreation have tapped into the Mississippi as it gathers steam, travelling across the breadth of Lanark County before emptying into the Ottawa River.

The tour starts and finishes in Almonte, approximately 90 km.

HIGHLANDS TOUR

Follow quiet roads to clean lakes and unspoiled rivers - this is true cottage country - and take the time to play a round of golf, satisfy your sweet tooth at a sugar bush or tackle one of the many well-groomed ATV/snowmobile trails, including the former line of the legendary "Kick & Push" Railway. Or just relax and enjoy the view.

Tour starts and finishes in Lanark Village, approximately 65 km.

LIMESTONE TOUR

The ruggedness that characterizes much of Lanark County gives way in the south to the Unstained Plain, once part of the floor of the prehistoric Champlain Sea, now a mainly flat region of exposed limestone and shallow soils. Transportation dominates the history of this region, from the Rideau Canal, a World Heritage Site built in 1826-32 as a military supply route linking Montreal and Kingston, to the railway, which took people and businesses to places water couldn't.

The land is more open here, the roads straighter, the discoveries delightful - whether it's antiques, golfing, a fine meal, or just a leisurely afternoon spent exploring in good company.

Tour starts and finishes in Smiths Falls, approximately 100 km.

MAPLE SUPREME TOUR

Smooth roads that often cross paths with the Clyde River and Mississippi River and Lake provide a relaxing drive through bustling towns and quiet villages in the Heart of Lanark. Follow this route to visit most of the stops along the maple trail.

The tour starts and finishes in Carleton Place, approximately 125 km.

TAY VALLEY TOUR

Following the War of 1812, a group of Scottish emigrants took advantage of government incentives to leave the impoverished lowlands and start a new life in the British military settlements of Upper Canada. These settlers maintained links to the old by naming communities and landmarks after familiar places back home, and by using their skills to build substantial mills, fine homes and tidy farms.

Tay Valley became the cradle for much of this Scottish - and Irish - industriousness, much of it lovingly preserved under the careful stewardship of subsequent generations.

Tour starts and finishes in Perth, approximately 120 km.
